# FROM OUR STUDENT MINISTER...

Do you find it annoying when Christians keep talking about Jesus and the resurrection? If so, you aren't alone. In Acts 4, Peter and John are "teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead." When the Sadducees heard this, they arrested John and Peter and put them on trial hoping that the fear of imprisonment would keep them from teaching about Jesus. It is clear that the Sadducees found their message of Jesus "annoying." They were hostile toward the message of the cross because it impeded on their lifestyle. They became uncomfortable as they saw people healed in the name of Jesus and watched men and women put their faith in Christ.

This next week we will find ourselves with a unique opportunity. We get to point people to the central moment in all of redemptive history...the cross and resurrection of Jesus. Even though we joyfully celebrate the resurrection everyday, this week is a little different. As we walk through the week leading up to Resurrection Sunday, let us be sure to consider the cross and the reconciliation we find there. Let us consider the empty tomb and the hope we have in seeing death defeated.

Teaching about Jesus and his resurrection from the dead might be awkward and uncomfortable at times, but it is worth it. When Peter and John were brought out and told to cease their preaching, their answer was inspiring. "...we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard." For those of us who live in the hope of the resurrection everyday, we should find something oddly familiar in this statement. To love and follow Jesus and experience the joy that he has brought into our lives should leave us with the same sentiment. How can we *not* speak of the God of all creation sending Jesus to die on the cross for our sins? How can we *not* seek reconciliation with all people after being reconciled to God?

The answer to these questions is simple....we can't not.
